

A Diverse Heritage: organs in historic urban and rural settings of New South Wales

The OHTA conference of 2010 will provide an outstanding opportunity to see and hear a wide range of old and new organs in some charming urban precincts and rural towns and villages of New South Wales. To be held after Easter, the conference will commence in Sydney and then move west through the Blue Mountains to Bathurst, Mudgee and Carcoar. The return to Sydney will be via the south, through Young, Murrumburrah-Harden, Yass and Gunning.

A feature of the conference will be recitals and demonstrations given by some of the brilliant local students who have studied in Sydney, Newcastle and Canberra in recent years. Our guest speaker will be Dr Frances Nobert, of Whittier California, who will present a lecture/recital on women organists and composers at Pitt Street Uniting Church, Sydney. Dr Nobert is Region IX Councillor for the American Guild of Organists (AGO) and has enjoyed a distinguished career as a lecturer, church musician and musicologist. Another lecture will discuss the cleaning and documentation project being carried out on the Hill organ of Sydney Town Hall.

One panel will revisit the discussion initiated at the 2005 Sydney conference: this related to future directions for the pipe organ in Australia. The panel will assess the situation five years on and discuss whether any progress has been made in promoting a more secure future for the instrument and its music, particularly in difficult church circumstances.

Some 28 organs will be visited in six days, representing the work of British, North American and Australian builders over a period of 150 years. Firms represented include: Aeolian, Brindley & Foster, Chappell, Dodd, J. Conacher, Davidson, Fincham, Forster & Andrews, Hele, Hill, Hunter, Kirkland, Norman & Beard, Pogson, Richardson and Walker.

Three breakfasts, two lunches, two dinners and five morning/afternoon teas are provided as part of the full registration fee.

PROGRAMME SUMMARY

Monday 5 April: A visit to six organs in Sydney's eastern suburbs in conjunction with the Organ Music Society of Sydney and Sydney Chapter of the AGO. Registration will occur at the first venue, All Saints' Anglican Church, Ocean Street, Woollahra, at 8.45 am. Organs by Forster & Andrews, Fincham, Hill, Pogson and Chappell will be included.

Tuesday 6 April: Visits to organs in Sydney's inner west, with lectures and a panel discussion. Organs will represent the work of Aeolian, Hill, Norman & Beard and James Conacher.

Wednesday 7 April: Travel to Sydney's west to see two notable organs, then across the Blue Mountains via Glenbrook to see the notable Hele organ. After a stop in Katoomba the day will end in Bathurst, where two nights will be spent.

Thursday 8 April: Travel through the delightful central west to Mudgee via Sofala. The fine Davidson organ in Bathurst and the recently-restored Brindley & Foster organ in Mudgee will be featured, along with other instruments. Further lectures/panel discussions will be held in a morning session.

Friday 9 April: While this will be our longest day in terms of distance covered, we will travel along some delightful back roads to see organs in the charming rural village of Carcoar and in the pleasant towns of Young and Murrumburrah – Harden. Organs by Richardson, Kirkland, Dodd and Fincham will be seen – our overnight stay will be in Yass.

Saturday 10 April: Return to Sydney via Yass, Gunning and Sydney's south west with a visit to three notable organs, including a mid-19th century chamber organ. The coach will return to the Mercure Hotel, Railway Square at around 5.00 pm (via the airport if necessary).

Sunday 11 April: Morning free. At 2.00 pm Dr Frances Nobert will give a lecture/recital at Pitt Street Uniting Church, followed by a concluding panel discussion. Participants are invited to attend a special Evensong for Low Sunday at Christ Church St Laurence, Railway Square, at 6.30 pm.
