

# WILLIS, WHITEHOUSE and WHEREAFTER

The 2014 OHTA Conference is an opportunity to see the recently refurbished Brisbane City Hall and to hear its newly restored Willis organ at a lunchtime recital – the most significant Queensland restoration for many years. Being in Queensland, the work of the Whitehouse firm will also be strongly represented. Whilst visiting some organs featured in earlier OHTA conferences, we will also inspect some newly built instruments, some older organs that have not previously been included, and explore instruments on the Gold Coast and hinterland – territory previously unexplored. We encounter a mix of instruments by local, national and international organbuilders, across a range of styles and sizes, ranging from 1878 to the present.
